We have been advised by Michigan Bell that substantial telephone number growth in the Detroit area necessitates splitting the existing 313 NPA (area code) and the simultaneous introduction of a new 810 NPA. Both NPAs will have interchangeable central office codes (i.e., the second digit of a central office code may be any digit 0-9).

The new 810 NPA will include Oakland, Macomb, Genesee, Lapeer, St. Clair and Sanilac counties. Small sections of Saginaw, Shiawassee, Livingston, Washtenaw, and Wayne counties will also be part of the 810 area. Communities such as Pontiac, Troy, and Southfield will be in the new 810 NPA. The 313 NPA will continue to include the Wayne, Washtenaw, and Monroe counties, as well as small sections of Jackson, Lenawee, Livingston, and Macomb counties. Communities such as Detroit, Ann Arbor, and Dearborn will remain in the 313 NPA.

The split of the 313 NPA is scheduled for 2:00 AM Eastern Standard Time, Wednesday, December 1, 1993. There will be a permissive dialing period starting 2:00 AM Eastern Standard Time, Wednesday, December 1, 1993 and ending at 2:00 AM Eastern Daylight Savings Time, Wednesday, August 10, 1994. During the permissive dialing period either 313 or 810 will be acceptable in a dialed number terminating in the new NPA. After the permissive period, calls dialed with incorrect NPA codes, as defined in the NPA split information published in the Local Exchange Routing Guide (LERG), will be routed to intercept. Changes in the local exchange routing information, based on data provided by Michigan Bell, will be incorporated into the LERG and the NPA NXX Activity Guide (NNAG) and be available June 1, 1993.

The dates that switching systems in the new 810 NPA will begin transmitting "810" in the calling number Automatic Number Identification (ANI) will be coordinated by Michigan Bell with the interexchange carriers.

Test calls to verify routing to the new NPA can be made by calling 810-264-4181. This test number will become available on October 1, 1993, and remain operational for a minimum of 30 days after the end of the permissive period.

The attached map illustrates the 313 and 810 configuration after the split. A listing of the communities to be served by each area code after the split is also included.

The dialing plan for the new 810 and 313 NPAs will be the same:

- All home NPA (HNPA) "local" and "zone" calls (generally calls that do not incur a charge) can be dialed on a 7 digit basis with no prefix; i.e., NXX + XXXX (7 digits) -- or with a prefix "1" and 10 digits; i.e., 1 + HNPA + NXX + XXXX (1 + 10 digits).
- All home NPA (HNPA) direct dialed "toll" calls (generally calls that incur a charge) must be dialed with a prefix "1" and 10 digits; i.e., 1 + HNPA + NXX + XXXX (1 + 10 digits).
- All foreign NPA (FNPA) direct dialed calls must be dialed with a prefix "1" and 10 digits; i.e., 1 + FNPA
 + NXX + XXXX (1 + 10 digits).

NOTE: In the communities of Livonia, St. Clair Shores, Northville Township, and Genoa Township foreign NPA direct dialed "local" calls, within each community, can be dialed on a 7 digit basis with no prefix; i.e., NXX + XXXX (7 digits).

- Operator assisted calls including credit card calls, collect, and third party calls will be dialed with a "0" prefix and 10 digits; i.e., 0 + NPA + NXX + XXXX (0 + 10 digits).


