Subject: Revised Dialing Plan for the 616 and 269 NPAs (Michigan)

On August 7, 2001 NANPA issued PL-294 announcing the split of the 616 NPA, and the assignment of the 269 NPA in accordance with an order in case number U-12850 by the Michigan Public Service Commission.

On April 30, 2002 NANPA convened an industry meeting, during which consensus was reached to modify the dialing plan for the NPAs in question. As a result of that consensus, the dialing plan for the 616 and 269 NPAs after the start of mandatory dialing on February 15, 2003 will be as follows:

- All local calls terminating within the home NPA will be dialed as 7-digits (NXX+XXXX).
- All local calls terminating within a foreign NPA may be dialed as 10-digits (NPA+NXX+XXXX) or 11-digits (1+NPA+NXX+XXXX).
- All toll calls will require dialing “1” followed by 10 digits (1+NPA+NXX+XXXX).
- All operator assisted calls, including credit card, collect, and third-party calls will require dialing “0” followed by 10-digits (0+NPA+NXX+XXXX).
